#### **OUR PEOPLE**

#### 4,291 full-time employees **Diversity**





Minority representation increased to 51%.

Female representation remained at 27%.

#### Retention

Employees with 10 or more years of service a key indicator of employee satisfaction and engagement—represent 31% of our workforce.

#### **PRODUCT RESPONSIBILITY**

**Leprino Quality and Food Safety** 

Leprino Foods has validated, verifiable food safety programs and management systems in place, which we regularly assess and improve to ensure effectiveness and to integrate new food safety tools and practices.

#### **Health and Safety**

Our Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) recordable incident rate and DART (days of restricted work activity or job transfer) rate increased by 18% and 11%, respectively, in 2018. Despite the increase, both were more than 40% lower than the Food Manufacturing average (U.S. Department of Labor's Bureau of Labor Statistics).

The Allendale and Lemoore East plants passed 1 million hours without a lost-time injury.

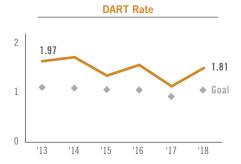


Animal Care in Our Dairy Supply

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL RESPONSIBILITY**

We continue to push toward our improvement goals. Energy intensity decreased slightly from 2013 baseline (1.12%); however, recent projects have led to a greater reduction in our carbon footprint. GHG emissions intensity decreased 8.91% from 2013 baseline to 2018, approaching our 10% reduction goal.

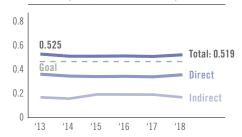
Water intensity increased due to product mix and food safety and quality demands. This prompted a more focused approach to water, including a metering project to understand usage with more granularity and inform future conservation and efficiency efforts.

#### **ENERGY REDUCTION GOAL**

Reduce energy intensity by 10 percent from the 2013 baseline by 2019.

(MMBtu per 1,000 lbs. of milk processed)

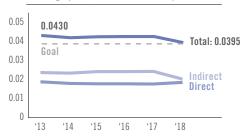


#### **GHG REDUCTION GOAL**

(MTCO<sub>2</sub>e per 1,000 lbs. of milk processed)

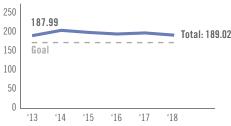


#### WATER REDUCTION GOAL

Recalculation of indirect GHG data with 2016 eGrid factors issued in 2018 resulted in nominal change from previously reported values.

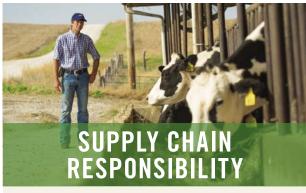
